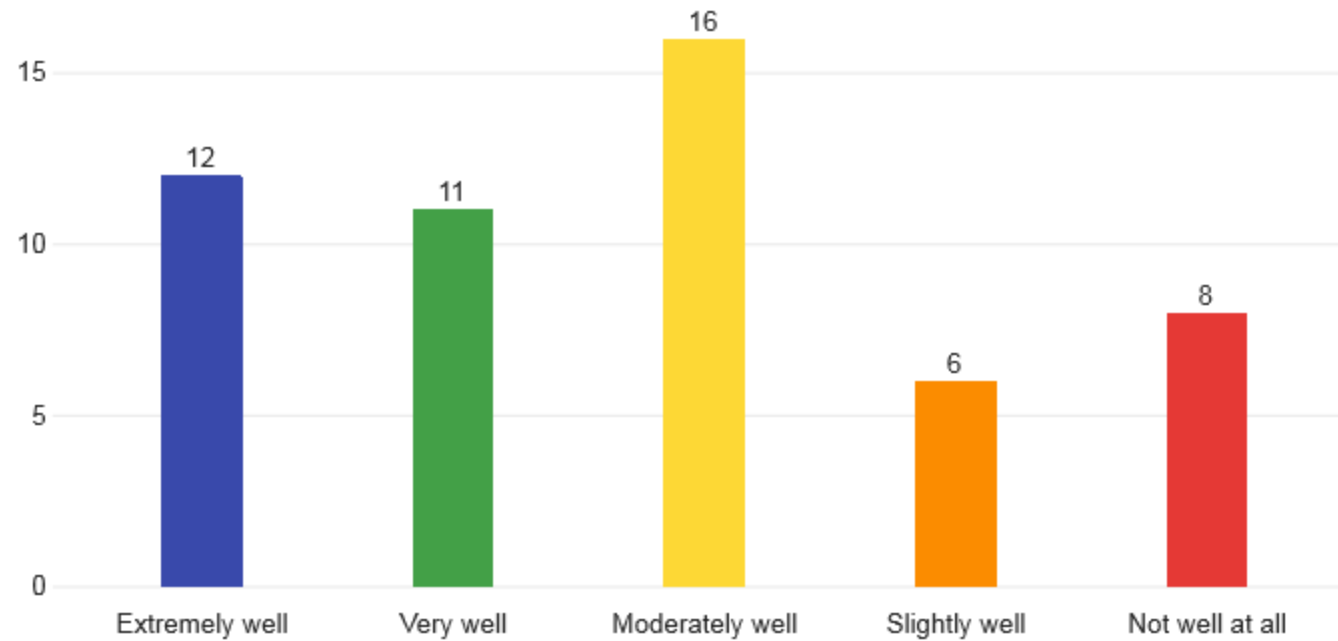

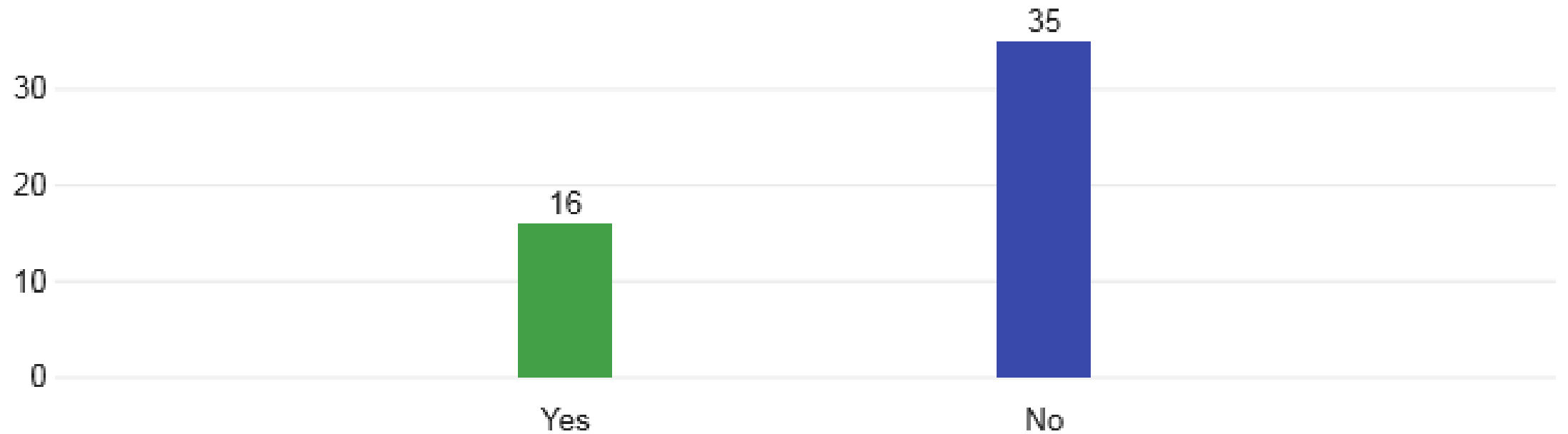

Overall, how well is remote learning working for your family?

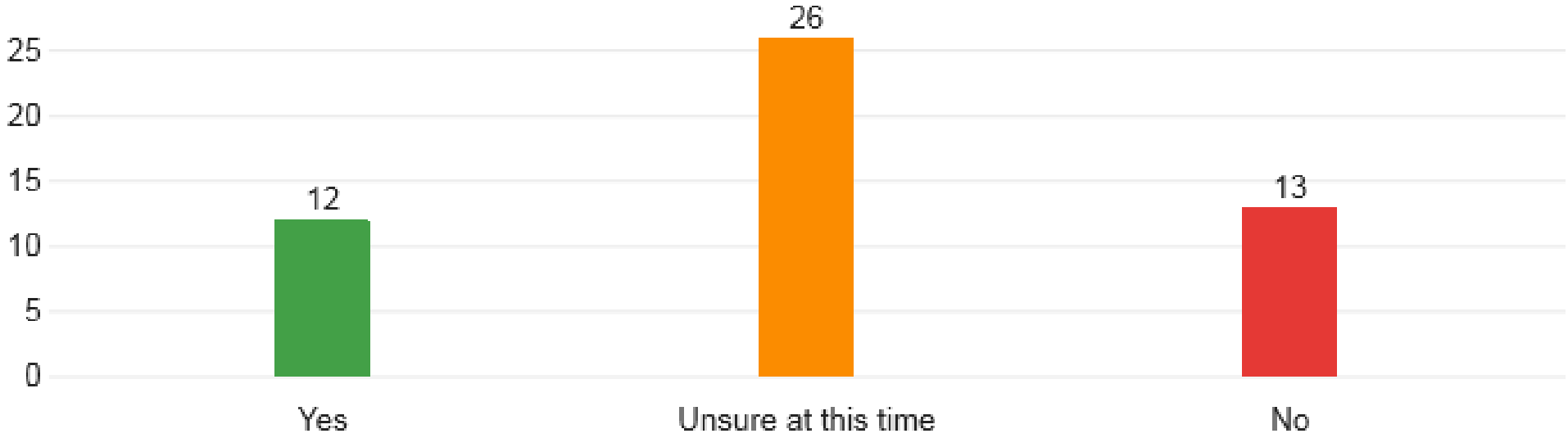
► Survey data

Land Trust Plan

We get \$68,200 from Utah Public Lands

- ▶ We will increase our RISE end of level math, language arts science scores in 6th grade by 4% compared to their cohort scores in the 2018-19 school year.
- ▶ We will accomplish this goal by implementing a platooning model of teaching in 6th grade where each of the three teachers will teach a specific subject to all 6th grade students.

- ▶ **Families can come through, get lunches and see costumes, and get a goodie bag!**

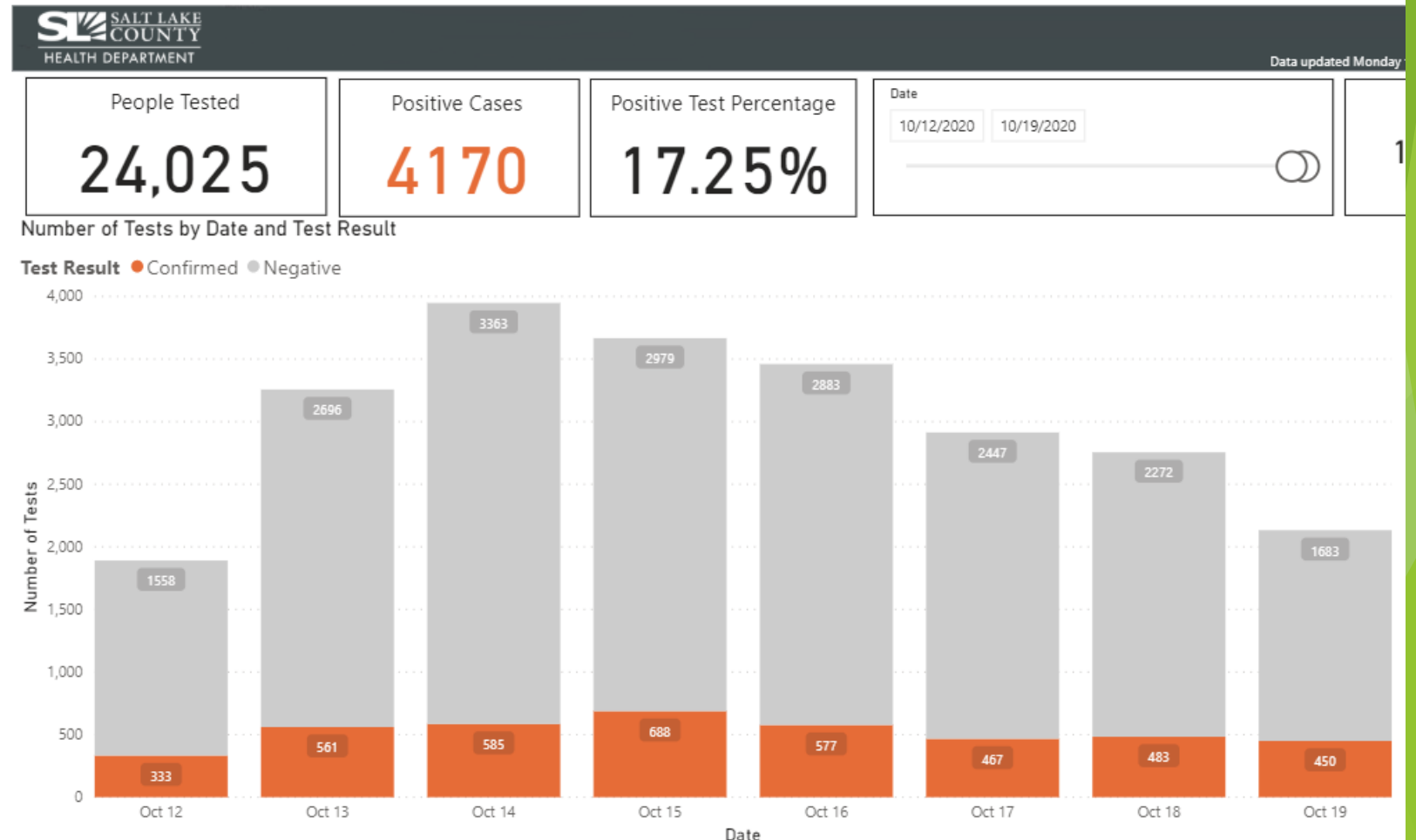

Safe Technology and Digital Updates

What filters are being used and how do they work?

- ▶ Salt Lake City School District uses the iBoss Internet Filter
- ▶ The principal receives a regular report and address issues as they arise
- ▶ Students and families should know that inappropriate searches noted

What is the district filtering policy on frequently used sites such as YouTube, Google Images, etc.?

- ▶ YouTube is generally blocked for students.
- ▶ We have opened YouTube for students during remote learning to create greater accessibility to educational resources.
- ▶ Google Images is not blocked, but is forced into Safe Search mode to prevent inappropriate images from displaying

What resources does the district provide concerning educating students on safe internet use and digital citizenship?
